# Week 9: Primary User Research – Protocol

- 1. Discuss the research setting/participants/context
- 2. Identify your research goals
- 3. Create an ideal (but flexible) plan to address those goals
  - Include lead moderator, tech lead, and observer(s)
  - Note items to observe and suggest possible data "tags"
  - Identify data collection tool (Paper notes, spreadsheet, note taking guide)
- 4. After the session: Externalize key takeaways to cohort-shared Freehand board

- App-specific
  - Gain insights around usability of the BikeTag.io platform.
  - Understand whether BikeTag meets the users' mental models.
  - Understand the desirability of a BikeTag app.

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### Task observations:

Without clicking anywhere, tell me your first impressions of this web app. What can you do here?

Show me how you would use this site. [ask any necessary follow-ups]

### Potential follow ups:

- What would you expect to be here?
- What do you think these nav bar headers mean?
- What did you expect when you clicked that?

- How did that make you feel?
- Why are you feeling that way?

- Was there anything on this website that stuck out to you?

Closing and thanks: Would you be more likely to use this app on mobile or on your computer?
How likely would you be to recommend this app to a friend in the biking community?
What points of confusion did you have with the current site?
